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## **SWIFTWATER AWARENESS LEVEL TRAINING 2016/2017**

In Feb 2015, a revised Swiftwater Provincial Operations Guideline was distributed; it now includes Swiftwater Awareness Training as a requirement for all SAR volunteers in the province.

Note: SAR Volunteers are required to complete this online training every 3 years per the Provincial Operating Guidelines.

In support of this requirement and following a series of requests from Provincial Ministries and Local Authorities for assistance with Swiftwater/flood response safety training, EMBC has retained the services of Rescue Canada Resource Group Inc. to provide online flood and swift-water hazard awareness training.

These training access keys are valid until July 2017 to make this training available for the 2016 fall flooding and 2017 freshet seasons.

Please feel free to distribute this information within your organization and to any personnel and/or organizations under contract to your organization. It is highly recommended that all personnel working within flood affected areas or adjacent to rivers, streams, creeks and/or tributaries complete basic hazard awareness training.

## How to register with the eLearning System

1. Go to <http://bc.rescuecanada.com>
2. Look for and click **register**
3. Read and agree to the terms
4. Enter your First Name
5. Enter your Last name
6. Enter your email address.
7. Do this again to confirm the email address.
8. Make up a password that has between 6 and 18 characters *e.g Fluffy or MySecret*
9. Enter the same password to confirm it.
10. Add your telephone number (optional but it helps us if we need to contact you)
11. Enter the Agency Key supplied by Emergency Management BC or your supervisor. It looks something like this: *DC45KB71*
12. Required - put in your place of work *e.g. Prince Rupert BCAS or Fire Hall #1, Chilliwack*
13. Required – choose your level of occupation from the list
14. Optional – choose your working environment
15. Optional – choose your occupational type.

Then click **Register** at the bottom. The button will only work, once everything has been filled in correctly.

If you have errors, it will tell you, for example your password is too short or is all lower case - that sort of thing.

Then it will confirm you have registered with an email and you can log in.

Your username will be your email address.

We do not store your password, so please record it safely!
