About this Course

This course prepares learners to assume the role of unit commander at a single alarm emergency incident. Learners will describe how to secure the scene, assess the situation, examine response alternatives, select and implement a response strategy, allocate resources, plan for expansion and demobilization of the event, and ensure public and fire fighter safety throughout.

This is one course in the JIBC Fire Officer program intended to meet some of the job performance requirements for NFPA 1021 Standard progressing through the first level of Fire Officer Qualification, Fire Officer I. The following areas of responsibility will be covered: human resource management and emergency service delivery.
